In the past fifteen years Jeannie has served on the Board of Directors of both the Pan American Development Foundation in Washington and Decatur House on Lafayette Square pursuing her interest in projects for the poorest of the poor in developing countries, and in historic preservation in America. Jeannie also served in recent years on the committee which annually sponsors the America Heart Association's Phoenix Arizona Heart Ball, and she actively supports the Crisis Nursery and Liberty Wildlife in Arizona where her family now lives.

Since arriving in India two years ago Jeannie's highest priority has been the US Mission and morale within the US Mission Community. She is the Honorary President of the American Women's Association, which provides guidance and support to American families living in Delhi.

Jeannie is also the Honorary President of the Delhi-based Umang Charitable Society, which works for under-privileged children and has undertaken several projects in slum areas. The mobile school van idea developed by this Society for disaster hit areas has been considered as a prototype for similar use in Afghanistan.
