We are writing to urge you to send forward a formal budget request for the Department of Veterans Affairs for \$3.7 billion over your initial budget request, in accordance with the terms of the Combined Appropriations Act, 2008 (CAA). This level of funding is essential to provide adequate services to America's veterans.
