

She started working life at the Daily Graphic as a Reporter and served in many editorial functions on the Daily Graphic and The Mirror for many years, with special emphasis on political, literary, and sporting stories, eventually becoming Editor of the Daily Graphic.

She left Ghana for the United Kingdom in January 1982. In London, she set up, published and edited "Talking Drums," a weekly newsmagazine with trenchant views on West African affairs for three and a half years.

When the magazine collapsed, she joined the BBC World Service as Radio Programs Producer. She reported from and served as a Correspondent in many parts of Africa for many years and became a well-known voice throughout Africa with her distinctive style on the Focus of Africa and Network Africa programs.

She returned home to Ghana in 2000 to join the NPP's election campaign. She was appointed a Minister of State to President Kufuor's government in January 2001 and is currently Minister of State responsible for Tertiary Education.
