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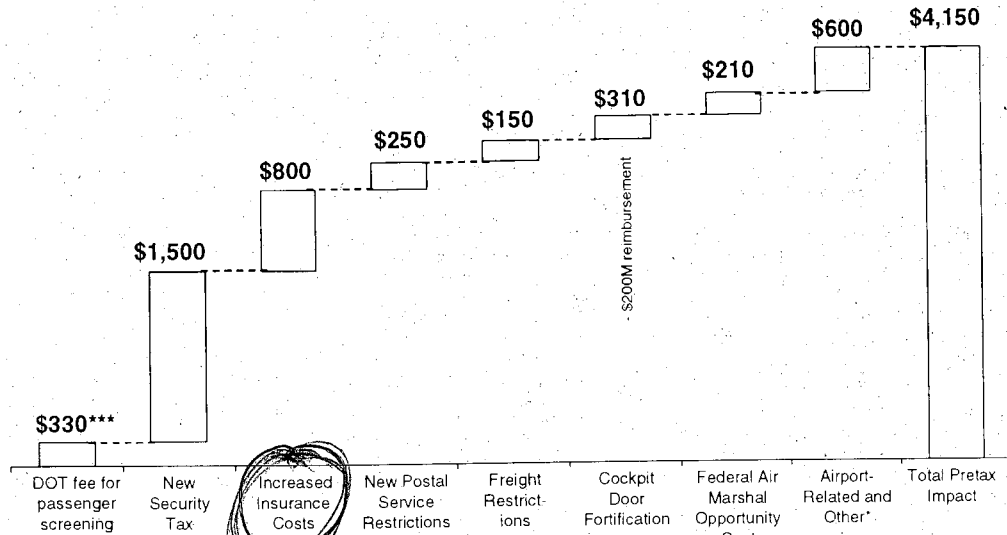

Financial Impact of Post-9/11 Policies

Estimated Incremental Industry Pretax Costs (\$ Millions), 2002 **

Post-9/11 taxes, fees and unfunded mandates have added more than \$4 billion to the industry's annual burden

Chart 10 is also helpful in understanding the magnitude of the problem confronting the airline industry. Despite the airlines' massive self-help measures undertaken in response to the 9/11 crisis, the inexorable growth of other expenses—beyond the control of the industry to manage and resulting in substantial measure from government action—has significantly contributed to the deepening economic meltdown of the industry.
