By way of background, I am an African American Republican, and I currently serve as a judge on the Circuit Court for Baltimore City. I was nominated to the federal district court for Maryland in 1992, but the Senate adjourned before my nomination was reached.

Before joining this bench, I was an equity partner in the Venable, Baetjer and Howard law firm. I joined Venable after service as an Assistant U.S. Attorney for the District of Maryland; I also served as Coordinator of the Presidential Regional Task Force on Organized Crime and Drug Enforcement. I have coauthored a book on federal civil procedure and have written numerous articles on legal subjects.
