Joy Flowers Conti is a shareholder with the law firm of Buchanan Ingersoll. She concentrates her practice on creditors' and debtors' rights, bankruptcy, healthcare law, general corporate law and nonprofit corporation law with a special emphasis on religious and religiously affiliated institutions. She is co-chair of the firm's Carta Group, which serves the nonprofit community, especially religious and religiously affiliated institutions.

Ms. Conti has represented nonprofit and for profit corporations in matters of governance and restructuring. She has also represented debtors and creditors, including secured lenders, bank groups, healthcare entities, municipalities, school districts, mutual funds and other unsecured and secured creditors in workouts and bankruptcy proceedings, including matters relating to prosecution and defense of claims, priority issues and restructuring of obligations. These have involved broad ranges of collateral including receivables, inventory, real estate and stock of private corporations. She has also represented secured lenders and borrowers in commercial finance matters including agent credits, participations, asset-based financing and receivable purchase transactions.

Ms. Conti was a tenured Professor of Law at Duquesne University and taught courses on corporations, corporate finance, corporate reorganizations and bankruptcy. She has authored several articles and chapters in treatises dealing with bankruptcy and corporate law and is a frequent lecturer at seminars on those matters.

Ms. Conti is a former President of the Allegheny County Bar Association (1993), and has served in the American Bar Association and is currently serving in the Pennsylvania Bar Association's House of Delegates. She is listed in *The Best Lawyers in America* and *Who's Who in American Law*. She is a member of the prestigious American Law Institute and the American College of Bankruptcy. She was the President of the Historical Society of the United States Court for Appeals of the Third Circuit and was selected by the Third Circuit to chair the Bankruptcy Judge Selection Committee for the Western District of Pennsylvania in 1994-1995 and 1987. She also was Governor-at-Large of the Pennsylvania Bar Association, was the Chair of the PBA Corporation, Banking and Business Law Section, and received the PBA's 1995 Anne X. Alpern Award which annually recognizes one outstanding woman lawyer.

Ms. Conti has served on numerous non-profit boards throughout her career, including terms as President of Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Pittsburgh, Inc. and as a Director of the American Red Cross, Pittsburgh Chapter, and of Family and Youth Services of Western Pennsylvania.

Ms. Conti is a 1973 *summa cum laude* graduate of the Duquesne University School of Law, where she served as Editor-in-Chief of the *Duquesne Law Review*.
