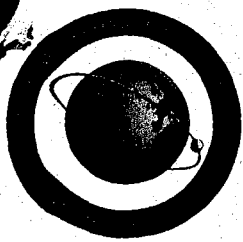

REFERENCE: Memorandum of Understanding, Dated July 2000,
Between the President's Foreign Intelligence Advisory
Board and the National Reconnaissance Office re
Archived Records Declassification Review (U)

(U) This is to inform you that the declassification review
of the President's Foreign Intelligence Advisory Board (PFIAB)
Historical Files, as specified in the Statement of Work (SOW)
attached to referenced Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), has
been completed. This review was conducted in strict accordance
with the directions set forth in your memoranda of 30 and 31
October 2001, same subject.

(U) The following is a summary of our activity:

a. (U) The actual review took place at the National
Archives/Office of Presidential Libraries classified holdings
area in the National Archives Building in Washington, D.C. Two
National Reconnaissance Office contractor personnel conducted
the review under the supervision of the Chief, Information
Declassification Review Center. The project began on 16 April
2002 and ended on 8 August 2002.

b. (U) All PFIAB specified files in the 31 identified
boxes were reviewed in accordance with the provisions of
Executive Order (E.O.)12958. The reviewed files were
categorized as follows: PFIAB Classified documents; PFIAB
unclassified documents; Other Government Agency (OGA)-originated
classified documents; and OGA-originated unclassified documents.

c. (U) A total of 2,521 documents, 23,274 pages, are contained in the specified files. We identified 898 PFIAB classified documents; 580 PFIAB unclassified documents; 572 OGA classified documents; and 471 OGA unclassified documents.

d. (U) A loose-leaf binder listing all files reviewed, sorted as above, is attached with this memorandum.

(U) Since PFIAB classified documents are exempt from the provisions of E.O. 12958, no further action is required for those documents. PFIAB and OGA unclassified documents are not subject to provisions of E.O. 12958, therefore, no further action is required on that category of documents. However, OGA classified documents are subject to E.O. 12958 provisions. Further action regarding the referral process is pending the decision of PFIAB. Finally, an optional task identified in our SOW, preserving reviewed files, is also pending your decision whether to proceed.

(U) Three pieces of electronic equipment were purchased with PFIAB funds to aid in the performance of this task: a DELL laptop computer, a printer, and a ZIP drive. This equipment is being held in the Presidential Libraries classified holding area of the National Archives Building along with a ZIP disk which contains files formatted identically to those found in the attached notebook. This equipment is the property of PFIAB and can be picked up through arrangements with personnel from the Presidential Materials Staff of the National Archives and Records Administration.
