V. SIGNIFICANT MATTERS/HIGH PROFILE LITIGATION

Based on the information provided, Mr. Jones does not appear to have been involved in what would be considered "high profile" litigation. Of the 10 most significant litigated matters he lists on the Senate Judiciary Questionnaire, only one was in U.S. District Court (#6, Metropolitan Life Insurance Company v. Betty J. Reick, et al.) The other nine are either State court civil cases or State court criminal cases (#2 & #4) when he served as an Assist. Public Defender.

Mr. Jones' client in Significant Litigation #2 (Commonwealth v. Charles Kaufman) appealed his conviction for first-degree murder in the strangulation death of an 11-year boy. Among the many grounds of his appeal, Kaufman alleged ineffectiveness of counsel. The Superior Court of Pennsylvania held that an evidentiary hearing be held to determine whether counsel was ineffective in failing to call or examine certain witnesses who could potentially establish an alibi for Kaufman's whereabouts at the time of the crime.

Mr. Jones has been sued numerous times in his official capacity as Chairman of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board.

Mr. Jones' 1992 Congressional Campaign Committee was admonished and required to pay a civil assessment of \$3000 by the Federal Election Commission (FEC) for violating a rule requiring that candidates provide interim notification to the FEC when certain contributions were received within a defined period.

VI. SIGNIFICANT LEGAL OPINIONS

It does not appear that Mr. Jones, because of the nature of his private law practice and his present position with the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board., has been in a position to render any significant legal opinions.

VII. PUBLICITY

Mr. Jones receives regular scrutiny by the media as the Chairman of a fairly high-profile state agency, the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board (PLCB). He is active in the state's efforts to curb underage drinking through the PLCB's participation as a member of the Pennsylvania Underage Drinking Coalition.

VIII. PUBLICATIONS

It does not appear that Mr. Jones, because of the nature of his private law practice and his present position with the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board., has been involved in any significant publications on any topic.

Mr. Jones is an occasional contributor to the debates on liquor control and consumption through letters to the editor and opinion-editorial pieces.

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
